WHAT ARE ALLERGENS?

Allergens are harmless substances that we encounter everywhere, every day. Every allergen has a source, an organism that produces the allergen and releases it into the environment. Pollen, pet dander, food, or medicine are some examples of these sources.









Most people never notice these substances in everyday life.

Things are different for people with allergies, though. Their immune system overreacts to certain substances.

Europeans suffer from a food allergy

There is an 8% risk of acute anaphylaxis, which can be fatal.

*Acute, allergic immune system reaction to repeated intake of foreign proteins, which affects the whole body.

DID YOU KNOW?

Climate change, various environmental factors, hereditary predisposition, and lifestyle are among the factors that can trigger allergies. They are exacerbated by the living conditions in industrialized countries. In Germany, over 34 PERCENT OF WOMEN and roughly 27 PERCENT OF MEN suffer from allergies.
